Lesson 2 – Zoom Meetings – How to Join and Participate.


I. As necessary we will continue to use the Zoom application for executive meetings and General club meeting so that all club members have an easier time staying connected during the ongoing pandemic. Zoom is simple to use and is a dedicated program that the club subscribes to and can be accessed from your computer, tablet, cell phone or your landline telephone. Zoom has <u>no affiliation</u> with Facebook, Instagram, or Twitter.

Everyone must have the Zoom application loaded onto their machine (PC, laptop, tablet or cell phone) to participate in a White Rock Garden Club meeting. You can use any device that has both a microphone and a speaker.

Install procedures from the general Zoom website. You will need a data or Wi-Fi to do this (only done once):

https://zoom.us/download is the website page

Select the download that matches your equipment (PC, tablet, phone, etc.), and download the application that matches your equipment, a Mac or Android. Follow the prompts during the download. The process only takes about 5 minutes.



To join a Zoom call, you will receive an email invitation that includes a hyperlink. The invitation will look similar to this:

The hyperlink is the blue underlined sentence of word, letters and numbers. You can click on the link in the email invitation at the meeting time and zoom will be opened in an internet browser. If that doesn't work for some reason you can copy the complete blue line and paste it into the URL line of a browser window.

To enter the Zoom call you will be put into a waiting room. Time in the holding area is minimal as the coordinator will let in only invited members. This ensures that only invited guests can join our call.

The coordinator will end the call for all members on the completion of the meeting. You can, however, remove yourself if you chose by selecting End on the bottom right corner of the screen.

Tips during the call:

- a. Only 1 person can speak at a time
- b. Turn off back ground noise
- c. Make sure you are facing the light. No back lighting.
- d. Audio can be turned off until you want to talk
- e. Video can be turned off if you don't want to be seen
